To Love As God Loves



Love is a very common word in our culture today. Love is a favorite theme in the media, in popular novels, in movies and television dramas, in songs, and in greeting cards. Love is usually portrayed as an emotion, a warm fuzzy feeling, or a pleasurable attraction. We even say ridiculous things like, "I just love chocolate ice cream." This is not the meaning of love we read about in today's Scripture. The greatest love that ever was, is, or will be, is the love of God described for us in the First letter of John: "In this way the

love of God is revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him." This is the love with which Christ came to live among us. Jesus speaks directly to us in John's Gospel: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." Unfortunately, our world today does not seem to value Gospel love.

Our culture urges us to do everything we can to have a full, prosperous, and happy personal life. We are to accomplish our goals, experience success, and be recognized with honor and prestige. We put ourselves first and later, perhaps, might be able to serve the welfare of others. This is a nice gesture, but truly a secondary one.

Jesus continues, "This is my commandment: Love one another as I have loved you." This is powerful. If we are to love as Christ loves, we may also be called to give our lives. However, it is important to recognize that we have examples of Christian love all around us. Think of parents who forget about themselves and their personal needs as they work tirelessly to provide a good life for their children. Oftentimes, the role gets reversed as the children eventually care generously for their aging parents. Families can be true examples of the love of Christ. In other contexts, we find people who have given their lives helping God's people. This is true Gospel love. Love is commitment. To love someone means to be willing to do whatever we can to help that person have a full and happy life. There may or may not be strong emotions involved, but the reality of love is in the dedication to the well-being of the other. A true lover is willing to forget self and focus on giving the other.

Today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles recounts the story of how the Apostles came to know the truth of God's love for all people. As members of the Jewish nation, Peter and the others knew that they were God's chosen people. What a shock it was for them when the Holy Spirit came down upon all present, Jew and Gentile alike, on that Pentecost feast. "They were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on Gentiles also." The apostles learned the lesson well, though. They recognized that the saving work of Christ was for all people, and they proceeded to baptize all present.

The entire human family is loved and redeemed in Christ. Our response is simply to strive to love as God loves. God's love is for all people. Following Christ, we are called to do whatever we can for the life of God's human family. This is today's lesson in love.





Happy Sixth Sunday of Easter St. Francis! I'm going to take a break from "talking" about the Nicene Creed for a few weeks because we are in the month of May, which is dedicated to our Heavenly Mother Mary! In each of the important events in Mary's life, the writers of the Gospels are quick to point out that Mary, though not understanding why things happened, would ponder the events in her heart. Mary treasured the things God did for her and spent time in prayer and reflection over them. As a result, her life flowed out of trust in what God has promised for her and through her Son Jesus.

Every day, we have the opportunity to imitate Mary in her love for God by pondering who He is and the marvelous promises He has given us. Mary demonstrated great faith and trust when she willingly accepted God's purposes for her. Let us all draw close to God and ask Him for the grace to imitate Mary's "yes" to Him. (Quoted from Father Antonio's homily on the Solemnity of The Annunciation of the Lord, April 8, 2024.)

Mother Mary's intentions are always to draw us closer to her Son and our Savior Jesus. This is why I would like to take some time and reflect on the numerous Marian apparitions. Marian apparitions are appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary, coming down from heaven to earth. In order for a reported appearance to be classified as a Marian apparition, the person or persons who claim to see Mary (the "seers") must claim that they see her visually located in their environment. Some of the most famous Marian apparitions approved by the Catholic Church include Our Lady of Guadalupe, Our Lady of Lourdes, and Our Lady of Fatima. I was asked by a parishioner a while back to "talk" about the different apparitions. So, since it's the month of May, let's begin!!!


The Apparitions that I'll discuss have been granted approval either through the local Bishop based on the direction of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith or received a direct approval from the Holy See. Some of these will be familiar and others may not, so take some time to do your own examination and explore!

<u>Our Lady of Guadalupe (1531).</u> The Catholic Church has constantly tributed to the Virgin Mary a special piety and worship. The Guadalupe Marian devotion is the basis of Christian history in Mexico, and it also supports the evangelization of the whole American continent. The Shrine of Tepeyac, where the sacred image of the Virgin of Guadalupe is the heart, has been a continuous goal of pilgrims from the XVI century,

not only from the Mexican nation but also of the entire American continent. Our Blessed Mother actually appeared four times to Saint Juan Diego and once to his dying elderly uncle, Juan Bernardino. The fourth appearance to Saint Juan Diego was the most wonderful. The first apparition took place on December 9, which at that time was the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception in the Spanish Empire, of which Mexico was then a part. Our Blessed Mother appeared to Saint Juan Diego, an older native American who had recently lost his dear wife. Juan Diego himself died in 1548, seventeen years after the apparitions, at the age of 74. On May 6, 1990, Pope Saint John Paul II, during his second pilgrimage as Pope to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, declared Juan Diego blessed. Pope Saint John Paul II later canonized Juan Diego on July 31, 2002 (Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe).

Of course there is much more information concerning this apparition. I hope this gives you an incentive to investigate and explore! Don't forget to check out our Church Library in the PRC! (Thank you, Jackie Wagner, for this gift!) Have a wonderful week!

In the Gospel today, Jesus says to us, "This is my commandment: love one another as I have loved you...You are my friends if you do what I command you."



Last year Bishop Barron and Word on Fire Ministries celebrated the Virgin Mary during May by asking their supporters to help pray 10,000 Rosaries throughout the month for the intention that those who have left the Church might return.

People logged their Rosaries on the WordOnFire website so that their locations would appear on a map, and, within 48 hours, they had already exceeded their goal. By the end of the month, more than 64,000 Rosaries were prayed all over the world!

Bishop Barron is once again asking everyone to join in praying at least 50,000 Rosaries for the conversion of the lost sheep among us—and he would love to


