#### **GROWING IN SPIRITUAL MATURITY**


Today's readings are not about physical sight but insight. They provide three eye-openers to help us grow in spiritual maturity as we come closer to Christ. Each reading is a spotlight to guide us on our way. Each reading is a challenge to deeper sight, to insight.

The first reading from the Book of Numbers is about two men, Eldad and Medad, who were given the spirit of God even though they were not on Moses' list.

The second reading from the Letter of St. James is a call to look beyond what we have to the deeper question of what we are doing with it. Here, St. James writes about Christians who are cheating their servants. His point is wider than that one instance. Do our financial prosperity, natural talents and access to various resources benefit the Kingdom of God?

Finally, in today's Gospel reading Jesus speaks about temptations. There are two kinds of temptations to avoid. There are the temptations that come to us, and about these Jesus uses very dramatic terms. If your eye, arm, or leg is causing you to sin, cut it off. It is a very graphic way of saying that we should not toy with temptations.

We have three insightful questions for all of us from today's readings. The story from the Book of Numbers asks us: Do we recognize our allies in the work of the Gospel? St. James asks: What are we doing with our assets to serve the Gospel? Today's Gospel asks us: Are we resisting both the temptations that come to us and our being a temptation to others by spreading gossip about the wrongdoing of others?

## CATECHISM



#### THE APOSTLE JUDE/THADDAEUS/JUDAS, SON OF JAMES/LEBBAEUS

May today find you filled with the peace of our Savior, Jesus! In today's Corner we will focus on the Apostle Jude. The name Jude is of Hebrew origin which means "praised" and "giver of joy." Remember Judah? One of the two tribes in the south. The name Judah is of Hebrew origin and means "praised."

From the Gospel of John 14:22, Judas, not the Iscariot, said, "But, Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?" With this relatively innocent and short question, the Apostle Jude (not Iscariot) forever has the distinction of being the last of the Lord's Twelve Apostles to ask the living, not-yet-resurrected, Jesus a question. Also, within the context of this New Testament passage is a dilemma that all of the early Church Fathers, and all of the biblical commentators of the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles since those ancient days have had to contend with: that of confusing Jude (Judas in Greek), the apostle who went on to spread the Good News of Jesus to the world with that of Judas Iscariot, the apostle who betrayed the Lord.

Recognizing that this possibility existed, the Gospel writers themselves did their best to make the distinction clear. In their lists of the Twelve Apostles, both Matthew and Mark refer to him as Thaddaeus. Luke lists his name as Judas, son of James. To confuse the situation even further, there exist a few New Testament translations where Matthew refers to the Apostle Jude as Lebbaeus, whose surname was Thaddaeus. This Thaddaeus/ Lebbaeus dilemma is quite easy to understand. Thaddaeus is a derivation of the Aramaic word tad, meaning "breast." Lebbaeus is derived from the Hebrew Word for "heart." Both words refer to someone who is loved by the person speaking his name. I hope this information cleared up the confusion.....a little!

Other than the brief question that he asked Jesus during the Last Supper and his listing of the Twelve Apostles in all of the four Gospels and Acts, nothing else is said about Jude. Other than the Western Church's tradition of celebrating him as being the "saint of lost causes," nothing else is known about him.

However, within the realm of the Eastern Church, especially that of the Armenian Church, there is a huge amount of written documents and oral history regarding the Apostle. As a matter of fact, they declare both their founding and Apostolic Authority by the Apostles Thaddaeus (the name Thaddaeus is preferred in the Eastern Church) and Bartholomew.

Jude/Thaddaeus was born in the Syrian city of Edessa, a city located along the Euphrates River in south central Turkey. Today, the city is known as Sanliurfa. He was a Hebrew born with name Lebbaeus. As a young man, he traveled to Jerusalem for a religious festival (a 600-mile journey!) where he heard a desert preacher name John the Baptist speak. He was so impressed with the message of the prophet that he ultimately was baptized by John. John was also impressed by this "man of heart," that John gave him the name Thaddaeus. And while traveling with the John the Baptist, he met Jesus. After John's execution by Herod, Jude/Thaddaeus followed Jesus. After Pentecost, Jude/Thaddaeus traveled to Edessa to heal the ruler named Abgar of an incurable disease. Edessa became the first recorded city in history to accept Christianity. After baptizing many thousands of converts and establishing many churches, Jude/Thaddaeus left Edessa forever.

Although there are conflicting traditions, it is generally thought that he next traveled through the region of eastern Turkey and continued to the region of modern-day Armenia (the ancient biblical land of the kingdom of Urartu) at the base of holy Mt. Ararat. Here's something really cool – the Apostle would have celebrated the Eucharist with wine produced from vines originally cultivated by old Noah himself! It was here around 60 AD, fifty miles from the summit of Mt. Ararat in what is today northwest Iran, that Jude/Thaddaeus would meet his martyrdom.

It was just twelve years after Pentecost. In the town of Shavarshan in the Ardaz province, Jude/Thaddaeus baptized Santoukhd, the daughter of the local king. When the news of her conversion reached her father, he was furious. The king then ordered all Christians killed – including his daughter and the Apostle. A church and monastery were built over the site of Jude/Thaddaeus' original grave in the year 66 AD in what is today is the West Azerbaijan Province, Iran. The Church of St. Thaddaeus still stands today. The vast majority of the Apostle's earthly remains are in the crypt below the Altar of St. Joseph of the Vatican. How and why the Apostle's remains arrived there seems to be a complete mystery! The majority of the "reasons" were a response to the eighthcentury Muslim conquest. St. Jude pray for us! Next week the Apostle Matthias! Have a most blessed week St. Francis!
